between my three Children, — And I do hereby appoint my
Father Robert Roberts to be my whole and sole Executor of this my
Last Will and Testament

Understanding; And that they respectively subscribed their names
as Witnesses to this Will, in the presence, and at the request of the
Testator, and in the presence of each other.
