 as Witnesses to this Will, in the presence, and at the request of the
 Testator, and in the presence of each other.

 County and State of Maryland being sick and weak of Body but of
 sound and perfect mind and memory Blessed be Almighty God for the
 same, do make and publish this my last Will & Testament in manner
 and form following that is to say.

First I give and devise unto my son William all my now dwelling
 plantation ^{being part of a tract of land} called Vienna, the Crop now on the ground Excepted as part
 of personal Estate, I further give and devise him my said son William
 and his Heirs twenty acres of Wood Land being part of a tract of Land
 called Chance to be laid off in the fourth east corner of my part of said
 tract of Land so as may be most convenient to the remainder part
 of said Land. My Will is that my said son William pay to his three
 younger Brothers and two Sisters ~~as directed for~~ Thomas,
 Robert, Samuel, Sarah & Ann one Hundred pound to be equally divided
 amongst them and paid as they arrive of Age.

Secondly I give and devise unto my son James ^{Smith} and his Heirs & Assigns
 all the remainder part of my Land called Chance with all the Improvements
 thereon, the Crop now on the ground Excepted as part of my personal
