 certainty of Death, and to the uncertainty of the time thereof, and  
 being desirous to settle my world affairs, and thereby be the  
 better prepared to leave this world, when it shall please God  
 to call me hence, do therefore make and publish this my last  
 Will and Testament in manner and form following, that is to  
 say first and principally I commit my Soul into the hands of  
 Almighty God, that gave it, and my Body to the Earth to be  
 decently Buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named  
 and after my dearly beloved wife Sarah Jobson's thirds are deducted  
 and my just Debts and funeral charges are paid I devise and  
 bequeath as follows, In primis I give and bequeath unto my
