And the said Elizabeth ~~was~~ being ill and finding death near at hand but of sound mind and memory to the best these deponents judgem^t.

Desired the said Richard and Margaret to take Notice that it was her Will and desire that her Daughter Francyna Cole should have what Estate she had, If she the said Francyna would bury her and pay her Debts, And at the same time ordered her a Will ~~to be~~ she had by her to ^{be} brought and burnt. In testimony of the above these deponents have set their hands and likewise made Oath that the above contents are true.
