


Just Debts and the Legacy abovementioned is paid, I am I do

January 17th 1702 Then came Ann Herring and William Pearce the two
 subscribing Witnesses to the withinlast Will and Testament of Benjamin
 Kelley late of Kent County deceased, and severally made oath on the
 Holy Evangelist of Almighty God, that they did see the Testator therein
 named sign and seal this Will, and that they heard him publish the same
 and declare the same to be his last Will and Testament, that at the
 time of his so doing, he was to the best of their apprehensions, of sound
 and disposing mind, memory, and Understanding, and that they
 respectively subscribed their names as Witnesses to this Will, in
 the presence, and at the request of the Testator, and in the presence
 of each other.

 Acres during the term that she remains my Widow, and at the
 Expiration of the said term of her Widowhood I give & bequeath
