 to me, to him the said Thomas Dollas his heirs Assigns for ever,
 And sixthly and lastly, I ~~constitute~~ nominate constitute ordain and
 appoint my beloved Brother Thomas Dollas my Executor of this my
 last Will and Testament, Revoking, making null and Void all former
 Will or Wills by me heretofore made, In Witness Testimony whereof I
 have hereunto set my hand and Seal this 3 day of August Seventeen hundred
 and Eighty four.

 together with these deponents in the presence of the Testator, and
 at his request, and in the presence of each other.
