financial and compliance audits on projects financed by bonds guaranteed by Montgomery County may be undertaken by the county government as necessary.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1980.

CHAPTER 232

(House Bill 1529)

AN ACT concerning

Montgomery County - Alcoholic Beverages (Sale of Wine at Wineries) MC 253-80

FOR the purpose of permitting wineries in Montgomery County to sell wine on the premises under certain conditions; and clarifying language.

BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages Section 12B Annotated Code of Maryland (1976 Replacement Volume and 1979 Supplement)

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That section(s) of the Annotated Code of Maryland be repealed, amended, or enacted to read as follows:

Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages

12B.

(a) A Class A light wine license may be issued by the clerk of the circuit court of the county in which the place of business is located to any holder of a Class 4 manufacturer's license. In Baltimore County a Class A light wine license may also be issued to a holder of a Class 3 manufacturer's license, who makes wine from agricultural products grown in Maryland. Baltimore County wineries applying for such a license are exempt from quotas established by the Baltimore County liquor board as to the number of licenses in that election district. It authorizes the holder to keep for sale and to sell light wines produced at the winery in any quantity to any consumer at retail at the place described in the license. IN MONTGOMERY COUNTY, THE-HOLDER-IS-LIMITED-TO THE HOLDER'S ON-PREMISES SALES OF
