THE SIGN SHALL STATE THE UNIT OF MEASUREMENT EMPLOYED. EACH SIGN SHALL BE LOCATED SO AS TO BE READABLE BY PASSING MOTORISTS.~~

~~(2) ALL NUMERALS ON THE SIGN SHALL BE UNIFORM AND SHALL BE AT LEAST 8 INCHES HIGH, BE AT LEAST 3 1/2 INCHES WIDE, AND HAVE A BRUSH STROKE OF AT LEAST ONE INCH. NUMERALS IN FRACTIONS, AND LETTERS, SHALL BE AT LEAST 2 1/2 INCHES HIGH ONE THIRD THE HEIGHT OF THE WHOLE NUMERALS.~~
