SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That chapter(s) of the Acts of the General Assembly be repealed, amended, or enacted to read as follows:

Chapter 174 of the Acts of 1978, as amended by
Chapter 707 of the Acts of 1979

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(1) The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as the Correctional Medium AND/OR MAXIMUM Security Facilities Loan of 1978 in the aggregate principal amount of \$26,000,000. This loan shall be evidenced by the issuance and sale of State general obligation bonds authorized by a resolution of the Board of Public Works and issued, sold and delivered in accordance with the provisions of §§ 19 to 23 of Article 31 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1976 Replacement Volume and 1979 Supplement, as amended from time to time).

(3) The actual cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the Treasurer and shall be first applied to the payment of the expenses of issuing and delivering the bonds unless funds for this purpose are otherwise provided and thereafter shall be credited on the books of the State Comptroller and expended, upon approval by the Board of Public Works, for the following public purposes, including any applicable architects' and engineers' fees:

~~CONSTRUCTION OF A~~ correctional medium AND/OR MAXIMUM security facilities FACILITY to provide [800] 500 beds. Selection of sites shall be made by the Governor, subject to approval by the General Assembly through the enactment of a joint resolution. THIS FACILITY, WHICH SHALL REPLACE 500 BEDS CURRENTLY AT THE HOUSE OF CORRECTION (AND UPON THE COMPLETION AND OPENING OF WHICH THE CAP IMMEDIATELY HEREINAFTER PROVIDED SHALL BE EFFECTIVE), SHALL BE LOCATED ADJACENT TO THE EXISTING HOUSE OF CORRECTION ON THE SITE OF THE PRESENT CATTLE BARN AND STORAGE SHEDS WHICH IS THE SITE CURRENTLY USED FOR THE TREATMENT AND REHABILITATION OF
