The Legislature finds and determines, based in part upon the report of the Maryland Commission to Study the Problems of Drug Addiction, as follows:

(b) A comprehensive program of [compulsory] treatment of drug [addicts] ABUSERS is essential to the protection and promotion of the health and welfare of the inhabitants of the State as well as to discourage the violation of laws relating to the sale, possession and use of narcotics and other dangerous drugs. Drug [addicts] ABUSERS are estimated to be responsible for one half the crimes committed in the City of Baltimore alone and the problem of drug addiction [is] HAS SPREAD rapidly [spreading] into the suburbs and other parts of the State. This threat to the peace and safety of the inhabitants of the State must be met. Not only crime, but unemployment, poverty, loss of human dignity and of the ability to fill a meaningful and productive role in the community, as well as damage to the physical and
