AN ACT concerning

Creation of a State Debt - The Maryland School for the Blind

FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt in the amount of \$5,000,000, the proceeds to be used to assist the Maryland School for the Blind in the construction of a Multi-Purpose Building, additions and alterations to the Andrews Building for a vocational education center, and walkways, and alterations to existing buildings to include elimination of architectural barriers and life safety deficiencies, subject to a certain condition; requiring that the expenditure of the proceeds shall be made based upon a certain ratio of matching funds for which the Maryland School for the Blind has made provision; and providing generally for the issue and sale of bonds evidencing the loan.
