In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed Senate Bill 850.

This bill extends the permissible hours of Sunday morning sales from 1 a.m. to 2 a.m. for holders of Class B-beer, wine and liquor licenses in Montgomery County.

House Bill 178, which was enacted by the General Assembly and signed by me on April 8, 1980 accomplishes the same purpose.

Therefore it is unnecessary for me to sign Senate Bill 850.
