exception regarding the application of this Act in Baltimore City and Anne Arundel County; and providing that the fund may not be considered as "current expenses" for certain purposes.

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed Senate Bill 891.

This bill allows a county governing body to appropriate money and establish a reserve fund for future plant maintenance and repair at a community college.

House Bill 355, which was enacted by the General Assembly and signed by me on May 20, 1980 accomplishes the same purpose.

Therefore it is unnecessary for me to sign Senate Bill 891.
