This bill transfers those regulatory functions which affect sediment control and the recycling of used oil from the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene to the Department of Natural Resources.

House Bill 1974, which was enacted by the General Assembly and signed by me on May 27, 1980 accomplishes the same purpose.

Therefore it is unnecessary for me to sign Senate Bill 1081.
