Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed House Bill 945.

This bill authorizes creation of a State debt to be used as the State share for the planning, design, construction and equipping of an Administration-Classroom Building and a Learning Resource Center on a new campus of the Capitol Institute of Technology.

Senate Bill 481, which was enacted by the General Assembly and signed by me on May 27, 1980 accomplishes the same purpose.

Therefore it is unnecessary for me to sign House Bill 945.
