Dear Mr. Speaker:

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed House Bill 1213.

This bill provides that the court may place a child in an emergency facility on an emergency basis if there is no less restrictive alternative and if the child has a mental disorder, is unable or unwilling to be voluntarily committed and needs inpatient treatment for himself and others.
