

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed House Bill 1792.

This bill reduces the period within which a report on competency to stand trial must be completed when no plea of insanity has been entered by a criminal defendant.

Senate Bill 873, which was enacted by the General Assembly and signed by me on May 27, 1980 accomplished the same purpose.

Therefore it is unnecessary for me to sign House Bill 1792.
