Pulver

- 1st That all actions brought before this Court by any Attorney belonging to it, shall be brought by his Neglect, Whosoever his Client is daunted the Attorney shall be liable to make his Client Satisfaction.
- 2nd That all Declarations be filed with the Clerk within fifteen days after appearance Entered.
- 3rd That all pleas be filed with the Clerk within five days before the Court of Term which shall be the next Court after appearance Entered, Except Petitions and shew to the contrary to be allowed of by the Court, and that all Affairs be tried upon the first day of the Court.
- 4th That the Attorneys Order their pleadings regularly first Plaintiffs Answer to Open up Cause without Interruption, & then the Defendants Answer to make his defence in the same manner. The Plaintiffs Attorney to have up Costs in pleading and neither use any indecent speeches each to other under penalty of two shillings six pence to be paid by any Attorney failing in any of the Articles.
- 5th In all actions where the fact is tried by a Justice of the Peace, the Jurors and respecting Jurors and hereby warned that after they have agreed on their verdict they keep the same secret until the Court demand their verdict publicly under penalty of two shillings six pence or according to the Nature of the Matter as the Court shall think fit.
- 6th Orderd that all Officers summoned as Jurors or Evidences to any Court, if the Court happen to be adjourned to some other day, the Officers so summoned are hereby required to make appearance at the Court adjourned according to the Nature of the summons without any further Notice from the Court.
- 7th That the Sheriff on every Court day do return his writs to the Clerk by Nine of the Clock in the Morning, under the penalty of one hundred pounds of Tobacco without some sufficient allowance of by the Court.
- 8th Orderd that any Officer coming into Court when sitting with their hats on their heads pay to the Cryer five pence or one shilling Sterling before they shall be allowed to sit.
- 9th That any Officer coming into Court when sitting with their hats in their mouths, or making any other indecent speech, shall pay to the Cryer five pence or one shilling Sterling.
- 10th That no Officer shall speak in open Court without leave first given and obtained under the penalty of one shilling Sterling to be immediately paid before the Officer so offending departs out of Court, or sit half an hour in the Stocks.
- 11th That any Plaintiff or Defendant if doth not appear in Court at the time of their Action being called, or any Juror or Evidences summoned, that when by the Court a messenger be sent to call the Jurors, or Evidences summoned, and they refuse to appear, shall pay to the Cryer five pence or one shilling Sterling when by the Cryer solemnly called shall pay to the Cryer five pence or one shilling Sterling.
- 12th Orderd that the Clerk receive no Pleas if they come not by hand in due time, and if the 3rd day appears, that such Attorney so neglecting shall pay to the Plaintiff five pence or one shilling Sterling according to his Client's choice.
- 13th Orderd that when the Defendant appears, that the Plaintiff shall appear at the Court, or if he doth not appear, the Court shall be non pro.
- 14th Orderd that no Attachment issue out of this Court upon any Judgment obtained in any Court, or Admiralty, shall be laid in the hands of any other Officer, but in the hands of the Sheriff or Admiralty against whom the Judgment is obtained.
- 15th Orderd that Richard Maclellin, the Clerk of the Court, have power to order summons for any Officer to give Evidences to the Grand Jury on behalf of Her Majesty.
