As by the ~~Verdict~~ in this Court by Rich<sup>d</sup> Macklin & Mich<sup>l</sup> Cook his atty<sup>ys</sup> May at large appeared. And the said Isaac in his open person came in to Court and says y<sup>e</sup> he cannot say y<sup>e</sup> said sum is due to him brought in but that he is and stands justly indebted unto the said Sam Taylor and is willing y<sup>e</sup> Judge to order ag<sup>t</sup> him for the sum which being by the Court heard and understood it is by them considered this twenty fifth day of August Anno Domini 1702 y<sup>e</sup> said Sam Taylor received the sum of two hundred and twenty and nine pounds of tobacco left of suit to the number of two hundred and twenty nine pounds and y<sup>e</sup> deft. in Morye etc.

The Petition of James Wyatt and Thomas Beckles praying a writ of Resurvey to ascertain the bounds of a piece of land called Ward Oak in Kent County wherein it is shewed that forasmuch as the former Jury appointed to resurvey y<sup>e</sup> same was illegal some of them being Attornies and Councils y<sup>e</sup> y<sup>e</sup> Resurvey by them made was not offered to any of y<sup>e</sup> Ends of y<sup>e</sup> y<sup>e</sup> Pet<sup>r</sup> causing the said Warrant to be read and thereupon an other Warrant was according to their prayer
