their oaths we of the Jury find for the Plaintiff

by the Justices that this was only the 2nd day of Sept^r 1702

horses of the price of one thousand five hundred pounds of tobacco
one yearling horse of the price of five hundred pounds of tobacco
one two three Barrows and two sheep of the price of one
thousand pounds of tobacco one Serv^t Man named Francisco Amaro
of the price of two thousand five hundred pounds of tobacco
one Copper pot of 12 gall^s one Iron pot of 12 Gall^s one Brass
Kettle one Iron Kettle one frying pan two powder dishes six plates
one pebble tawhard one powder pot with six pints three pipes one
pigeon one spit three tables six chairs of the price of four thousand
four hundred pounds of tobacco one feather bed and bedstead of the
price of one thousand four hundred pounds of tobacco one bedstead
and some furniture of the price of two hundred and fifty pounds of tobacco
one flock bed and one washing Tub of the price of four hundred and
fifty pounds of tobacco one flock bed and some other things of the price
of three hundred pounds of tobacco one large feather bed of the price of
two thousand pounds of tobacco one large chest of the price of one
