Alexander Graves et ux William Whitehead of said County was made to answer unto Alexander Graves and Mary his wife of a plea of trespass upon the case

And whereupon the said Alex & Mary by their atty Complainers & sayeth that where as the said Mary when sole to wit in the year of our Lord 1400 in said County County in the jurisdiction of this Court at the special instance & request of the said William had sold & Delivered unto him the said William by the said Mary Divers Goods Wares & merchandizes as by an act to this Deeds annexed & here in Court brought the same app amounting in the whole to the sum of four pounds sixteen shillings six pence ster in Contraion whereof the said William upon himself assumed the said Mary when sole faithfully promised that he by said William the foresaid sum of 4. 16. 06 ster unto y said Mary he would well & truly pay when thereunto of afterwards required yet notwithstanding the foresaid sum of 4. 16. 06 ster according to his promise & assumption unto the said Mary when sole he did not pay although often demanded neither hath y said sum paid y same 4. 16. 06 ster unto y said Alex & Mary no unto either of them since their Intermarriage although of the therunto required but y same to pay he hath changed & redressed & still doth deny by refuge & unjustly Detaine to the Damage of a parts of of the money & thereupon they bring this suite
