Whereas John Boyer bought a certaine Serv. woman named Mary Medford at underworth for and in Consideration that the said John could well and firmly cure the said Serv. of some Ulcers wherewith she was afflicted It appeared to the Court that he had discharged the said Serv. without offering the same cures and thereupon was ordered that a summons issue ag<sup>t</sup> the said John to cause him to answer the premises which accordingly issued. But the said John not appearing It was ordered that the said Serv. go and remaine with the said Boyer (who had an order given her for that purpose) until the said Boyer make his small Appearances at this Court to answer a writ.

James Wyat comes into Court and proves an account ag<sup>t</sup> his Serv. for days run away time which was allowed and ordered y<sup>e</sup> said Serv. serve according to Law for the same

Thomas Hyndley continued overseer of the highways for y<sup>e</sup> Ensuing year in the same hundred as before

San<sup>t</sup> Kelley appointed overseer of the highways of Langford's Bay hundred in the stead of James Watson

Nicholas Coude sworn as undersher to M<sup>r</sup>. John Hawkins

Order It is consented and agreed upon by M<sup>r</sup>. John Whittington, J<sup>r</sup>. Falter Phillip Hopkins and John Haires in Court sitting that there shall be allowed sixty pounds of Tobacco for every somer of any Serv. into his custody to be paid by the person committed, which was by the Court ordered to be entered as above

Wm Dakers being presented for swearing and having bond in the Rocks according to Law was cleared paying his fees

John Bonst appointed overseer of seven hundred to clear from Plains Mill to the head of the river

John Drummond appointed overseer of the highways from Dr. John Falter into the maine road to Whitwells Branch and from thence down the road to Cap. Dr. Whittingtons
