The petition of David Dodg (Clerk of this Court) about admitting a certain  
John Hackett, to officiate in y<sup>e</sup> sd David's place this Court, for some reasons, the  
sd petition, is read, and is granted as prayed

Robert Stillkinson being bound by recogn<sup>ce</sup> last Court to appear at this Court,  
The said Rob<sup>t</sup> appears now, & is thereupon Discharged from his sd recogn<sup>ce</sup>, he  
giving security for his personal appear<sup>ance</sup>, on Thursday next before this Court  
whereupon M<sup>rs</sup> John Sauter comes bound for y<sup>e</sup> sd Rob<sup>t</sup> for recogn<sup>ce</sup> in y<sup>e</sup> sum of five

who petitions this Court about y<sup>e</sup> same, upon w<sup>ch</sup> the Court orders y<sup>e</sup> sd Earle to pay  
y<sup>e</sup> sd five and twenty sh<sup>ill</sup> w<sup>ch</sup> y<sup>e</sup> sd Jubb

Ordered of Timothy Doe serve M<sup>rs</sup> John Bells for y<sup>e</sup> space of three years, to receive  
paying four sh<sup>ill</sup> and pence of tobacco to y<sup>e</sup> sd Timothy's credit, and all y<sup>e</sup> expen-  
-tion of y<sup>e</sup> sd time to pay y<sup>e</sup> sd Timothy one thousand pounds of tobacco or one pent  
of Coashes

Anne Veniard Daughter to Elizabeth Veniard adjudged by this Court to be  
five years of age and to serve a certain D<sup>ns</sup> Lodge until y<sup>e</sup> sd Anne  
comes to y<sup>e</sup> age of sixteen years
