Dies when free

Charles Hollinsworth being ordered to keep good rules in his house according to rules and statutes, he being an ordinary keeper. The s<sup>d</sup> Charles comes into Court and acknowledges himselfe to be holden and firmly bound unto her sacred majesty Queen Anne of England &c. likewise comes into Court William Goobin and Patrick Cragh and acknowledges themselves to be indebted as above s<sup>d</sup> in y<sup>e</sup> sum of ten pounds ster<sup>l</sup>. Each The s<sup>d</sup> Jone as above s<sup>d</sup> to be levied as y<sup>e</sup> Law Directs if y<sup>e</sup> Court Doe not keep good rules and orders in his house as y<sup>e</sup> Law (in such Cases) Directs.

Walter Bownell (in y<sup>e</sup> behalfe of William North being ord<sup>d</sup> to find security as above, comes into Court and acknowledges himselfe to be holden and firmly bound unto her sacred majesty Queen Anne of England &c. in y<sup>e</sup> sum of twenty pounds ster<sup>l</sup> likewise comes into Court William Whitehead and Christopher Lind. and acknowledges themselves to be indebted as above s<sup>d</sup> in y<sup>e</sup> sum of ten pounds ster<sup>l</sup> each y<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> severall sums to be levied respectively as y<sup>e</sup> Law req<sup>rs</sup> if in Case y<sup>e</sup> William North or Walter Bownell in his behalfe Doe not keep good rules and orders in thier house (being an ordinary or house of Entertainment) as y<sup>e</sup> Law (in such Cases) Directs

Thomas being ord<sup>d</sup> to find security as above comes into Court and acknowledges himselfe to be holden and firmly bound unto her sacred majesty Queen Anne of England &c. in y<sup>e</sup> sum of twenty pounds ster<sup>l</sup> likewise comes into Court William Sigley and Richard Bishop and acknowledges themselves to be severally indebted as above s<sup>d</sup> in y<sup>e</sup> sum of ten pounds ster<sup>l</sup> each, y<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> severall sums to be levied respectively (as y<sup>e</sup> Law requires) if in Case y<sup>e</sup> Thomas Jone Doe not keep such rules and orders in his his house (being an ordinary or house of Entertainment) as y<sup>e</sup> Law (in such Cases) Directs
