

exceeding the daily catch limit established by the Secretary by more than 10 {percent.} PERCENT, ~~UNLESS A PERSON OBTAINS THE APPROVAL OF THE DEPARTMENT TO UNLOAD~~ HOWEVER, IN EMERGENCIES, THE DEPARTMENT MAY AUTHORIZE UNLOADING UP TO TWO DAILY CATCH LIMITS IN 1 DAY. A licensed oyster buyer or dealer may sell or attempt to sell oysters which he shows were purchased from another catcher.

(d) All oysters landed or offered for sale on any day by any person licensed to catch oysters which are in excess of the daily catch limit shall become the property of the State, and payment shall be made directly to the State by the buyer or receiver of the oysters at the same price paid the catcher for the balance of his catch. All funds received under this subsection shall be deposited to the credit of the Fisheries Research and Development Fund and shall be used for repletion of the natural oyster bars of the State.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1981.

CHAPTER 206

(House Bill 1451)

AN ACT concerning

Maryland Environmental Service - Grant Eligibility

FOR the purpose of providing that the Maryland Environmental Service may be considered the same as a municipality in the receipt of certain grants.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That section(s) of the Annotated Code of Maryland be repealed, amended, or enacted to read as follows:

(q) To make application for, receive, and accept from any state or federal government, or any unit,
