the license of an individual whose license is suspended or revoked under § 11-310(a)(4) of this subtitle, which relates to habitual intoxication or addiction.

(c) The Board may not reinstate a license that has been suspended or revoked for more than 2 years. However, the former licensee may apply for a new license under the current licensing requirements of this title.]

[Subtitle 4. Prohibited Acts; Penalties]

[11-401.

A person may not practice, attempt to practice, or offer to practice osteopathy in this State unless licensed by the Board.]

[11-402.

- (a) Unless authorized to practice osteopathy under this title, a person may not represent to the public by title, by description of services, methods, or procedures, or otherwise, that the person is authorized to practice osteopathy in this State.
- (b) (1) Except as provided in this subsection, unless authorized to practice under this title, a person may not use the words or terms "osteopath", "osteopathist", "osteopathy", "doctor of osteopathy", "diplomate in osteopathy", or "D.O." with the intent to represent that the person practices osteopathy.
- (2) A holder of a degree of osteopathy who is authorized to practice medicine in this State may use the degree or an abbreviation for the degree in connection with the name of the holder.]

[11-403.

A person may not practice or attempt to practice osteopathy under a false name.]

[11-404.

An applicant for a license may not represent falsely that the applicant holds a diploma or degree from a college or university accredited by the American Osteopathic Association.]

[11-407.

(a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, a person who violates any provision of this subtitle is guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction is subject to a fine not exceeding \$500 or imprisonment in jail not exceeding 90 days or both.
