other disposition of [such] THE funds, at which time all [such] funds shall be promptly and fully accounted for by the broker. [In no event shall any] A licensee hereunder MAY NOT commingle any [such] funds with his own or use any [such] funds for any purpose other than the purpose for which [such] THE funds were entrusted to him.

(b) Failure of any licensee to abide by the requirements of this section shall, in addition to any other penalties provided by law, be sufficient cause for the suspension or revocation of his license, in the discretion of the Commission.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1981.
