(D) UPON TAKING OFFICE, EACH APPOINTEE TO THE OFFICE OF HEALTH OFFICER SHALL TAKE THE OATH REQUIRED BY ARTICLE I, § 9 OF THE STATE CONSTITUTION.

(E) EACH HEALTH OFFICER IS AN UNCLASSIFIED STATE EMPLOYEE.

(F) THE HEALTH OFFICER FOR A COUNTY IS ENTITLED TO:

(1) THE SALARY PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET;

(2) ANY ADDITIONAL SALARY THAT THE COUNTY PROVIDES; AND

(3) REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES UNDER THE STANDARD STATE TRAVEL REGULATIONS, AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET.

~~(G) THE HEALTH OFFICER FOR A COUNTY SERVES AT THE PLEASURE OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF THAT COUNTY, BUT MAY NOT BE REMOVED WITHOUT THE CONCURRENCE OF THE SECRETARY.~~

(G) THE HEALTH OFFICER FOR A COUNTY SERVES AT THE PLEASURE OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF THAT COUNTY AND THE SECRETARY. THE HEALTH OFFICER FOR A COUNTY MAY BE REMOVED FROM OFFICE WITH THE CONCURRENCE OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF THAT COUNTY AND THE SECRETARY.

(H) THIS SECTION DOES NOT PREVENT AN INDIVIDUAL FROM SERVING AS HEALTH OFFICER FOR MORE THAN ONE COUNTY.
