(b) An appeal pursuant to this section shall be taken by filing an order for appeal with the register of wills within 30 days after the date of the final judgment from which the appeal is taken. Within 30 days thereafter the register of wills shall transmit [a transcript] ALL PLEADINGS AND ORDERS of the proceedings to the court to which the appeal is taken, unless the orphans' court from which the appeal is taken extends the time for transmitting [the transcript] THESE PLEADINGS AND ORDERS

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1981.

CHAPTER 346

(House Bill 109)

AN ACT concerning

Probation Before Judgment - Fines and Penalties
