- dollars (\$15.00) for each property; except that in Baltimore City or any county which has a paid full-time solicitor, counsel or attorney, this fee shall be collected and paid into the general funds of the city or county.
- (iv) The auctioneer's fee, which in no case shall exceed ten dollars (\$10.00) for any day when one, two or three properties are sold; and for any day when four or more properties are sold the fee shall be three dollars (\$3.00) for each property sold. However, in Wicomico County the auctioneer's fee shall be \$10 for each property sold, but in no event shall the auctioneer's fee be less than \$50 per day or greater than \$200 per day.
- (v) In [Baltimore City,] Baltimore and Cecil counties, where provision has been made for the posting of the premises to be sold, a sum not in excess of seven dollars and fifty cents (\$7.50).
- (vi) In Worcester County a fee to the attorney representing the county treasurer, up to thirty-five dollars (\$35) for each property, to be approved by the county treasurer and by the Board of County Commissioners.
- (VII) IN BALTIMORE CITY A FEE NOT TO EXCEED \$5 FOR THE MAILING OF STATEMENTS AND NOTICES.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1981.
