The County Budget Officer, within thirty (30) days after the completion of each annual levy, shall deliver to the County Treasurer a full copy thereof, together with a list of taxpayers and their assessment, and the Treasurer shall collect the same according to law and pay over to the county or the parties entitled thereto the amount so collected.
