EACH DAY THAT A VIOLATION OF ANY SECTION OF SUBTITLE 4 OF THIS TITLE CONTINUES CONSTITUTES A SEPARATE OFFENSE.

(D) REPORT OF CONVICTIONS.

WITHIN 10 DAYS AFTER A COURT RENDERS THE CONVICTION, THE COURT SHALL REPORT TO THE BOARD EACH CONVICTION OF A PHARMACIST FOR:

- (1) ANY CRIME RESPECTING THE PHARMACY OR DRUG LAWS THAT INVOLVES PROFESSIONAL MISCONDUCT; OR
- (2) ANY CRIME THAT INVOLVES THE STATE LAW REGARDING CONTROLLED DANGEROUS SUBSTANCES OR THE FEDERAL NARCOTIC LAWS.
