

(5) MAY NOT HAVE A HOUSEHOLD MEMBER WHO PARTICIPATES IN A COMMERCIAL OR PROFESSIONAL FIELD RELATED TO MEDICINE; AND

(6) MAY NOT HAVE HAD WITHIN 2 YEARS BEFORE APPOINTMENT A SUBSTANTIAL FINANCIAL INTEREST IN A PERSON REGULATED BY THE COMMISSION.

(C) SAME -- RESTRICTION.

WHILE A MEMBER OF THE COMMISSION, A CONSUMER MEMBER MAY NOT HAVE A SUBSTANTIAL FINANCIAL INTEREST IN A PERSON REGULATED BY THE COMMISSION.

(D) SERVICE IN DUAL CAPACITIES PROHIBITED.

(1) AN INDIVIDUAL MAY NOT SERVE AS A MEMBER OF THE COMMISSION IN A DUAL CAPACITY.

(2) TO AVOID SERVICE BY AN INDIVIDUAL IN A DUAL CAPACITY, THE SECRETARY MAY APPOINT A PRACTICING LICENSED PHYSICIAN FROM A LIST OF NOMINEES SUBMITTED BY THE FACULTY IN ACCORDANCE WITH SUBSECTION (A)(3) OF THIS SECTION.

(E) OATH.

BEFORE TAKING OFFICE, EACH EX OFFICIO MEMBER AND APPOINTEE TO THE ~~BOARD~~ COMMISSION SHALL TAKE THE OATH REQUIRED BY ARTICLE 1, § 9 OF THE STATE CONSTITUTION.

(F) TENURE; VACANCIES.

(1) THE TERM OF A EACH APPOINTED MEMBER IS 3 YEARS, EXCEPT THAT THE INITIAL TERM OF ONE OF THE CONSUMER MEMBERS IS 2 YEARS.

(2) THE TERMS OF THE APPOINTED MEMBERS ARE STAGGERED AS REQUIRED BY THE TERMS PROVIDED FOR MEMBERS OF THE COMMISSION ON JULY 1, 1981.

(3) AT THE END OF A TERM, A MEMBER CONTINUES TO SERVE UNTIL A SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED AND QUALIFIES.

(4) A MEMBER WHO IS APPOINTED AFTER A TERM HAS BEGUN SERVES ONLY FOR THE REST OF THE TERM AND UNTIL A SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED AND QUALIFIES.

(G) REMOVAL OF MEMBER.

A MEMBER OF THE COMMISSION MAY BE REMOVED BY THE SECRETARY FOR NEGLECT OF DUTY, MISCONDUCT, MALFEASANCE, OR MISFEASANCE IN OFFICE.
