

of scope. Unlike a new resident of this State, a long standing resident of this State must await actual licensing before being able to practice social work. Also, there is no requirement that the new resident of this State be authorized to practice social work in another state.

18-302. QUALIFICATIONS OF APPLICANTS.

(A) IN GENERAL.

TO QUALIFY FOR A LICENSE, AN APPLICANT SHALL BE AN INDIVIDUAL WHO MEETS THE APPLICABLE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION.

(B) SOCIAL WORK ASSOCIATE LICENSE.

AN APPLICANT FOR A SOCIAL WORK ASSOCIATE LICENSE SHALL HAVE A BACCALAUREATE DEGREE:

(1) FROM AN ACCREDITED COLLEGE OR UNIVERSITY;
AND

(2) BASED ON A SOCIAL WORK PROGRAM ACCREDITED BY THE COUNCIL ON SOCIAL WORK EDUCATION.

(C) GRADUATE SOCIAL WORKER LICENSE.

AN APPLICANT FOR A GRADUATE SOCIAL WORKER LICENSE SHALL HAVE A MASTER'S DEGREE FROM AN ACCREDITED COLLEGE OR UNIVERSITY AND BASED ON A GRADUATE SOCIAL WORK PROGRAM ACCREDITED BY THE COUNCIL ON SOCIAL WORK EDUCATION.

(D) CERTIFIED SOCIAL WORKER LICENSE.

AN APPLICANT FOR A CERTIFIED SOCIAL WORKER LICENSE SHALL HAVE:

(1) A MASTER'S DEGREE:

(I) FROM AN ACCREDITED COLLEGE OR UNIVERSITY AND BASED ON A GRADUATE SOCIAL WORK PROGRAM ACCREDITED BY THE COUNCIL ON SOCIAL WORK EDUCATION; AND

(II) 2 YEARS OF SOCIAL WORK EXPERIENCE UNDER THE SUPERVISION OF A LICENSED CERTIFIED SOCIAL WORKER;
OR

(2) (1) A DOCTORATE IN SOCIAL WORK; AND

(II) COMPLETED A GRADUATE SOCIAL WORK PROGRAM ACCREDITED BY THE COUNCIL ON SOCIAL WORK EDUCATION.
