Article 64A - Merit System

37.

(a) (2) Any employee using less than full vacation leave allowable beginning January 1, 1942, shall be entitled to have such unused leave accumulated up to 35 working days, which shall be available to such employee for vacation leave at any time, with the approval of the head of the department. In addition to annual vacation leave, any employee is entitled to sick leave with pay for not in excess of 30 working days in any calendar year, and from and after January 1, 1975, in addition to such annual vacation leave, any employee shall be entitled to sick leave with pay for not in excess of 15 working days in any calendar year; provided, however, that if any employee in any calendar year
