- (a) (3) "Nursing shortage area" means a recognized area of nursing service or specialization, such as gerontological nursing, in which the State Board of Higher Education, considering any recommendations of the State Board of [Nursing] Examiners OF NURSES, has determined that there exists a shortage of qualified nurses.
- (b) (2) The State Board of Higher Education shall identify and establish nursing shortage areas considering any recommendations of the State Board of [Nursing] Examiners OF NURSES.
