19-904. STANDARDS FOR CONSTRUCTION AND SAFETY.

(A) IN GENERAL.

A BUILDING THAT CONTAINS A HOSPICE SHALL:

- (1) BE CONSTRUCTED SOUNDLY; AND
- (2) MEET THE STANDARDS FOR CONSTRUCTION AND SAFETY THAT THE COUNTY OR MUNICIPALITY IMPOSES ON A SINGLE-FAMILY RESIDENCE.
  - (B) PROHIBITED CLASSIFICATION.

A BUILDING THAT CONTAINS A HOSPICE MAY NOT BE REQUIRED TO COMPLY WITH HEALTH AND SAFETY STANDARDS FOR AN INSTITUTION.
