19-910. TERM AND RENEWAL.

(A) TERM OF LICENSE.

A LICENSE EXPIRES ON THE THIRD ANNIVERSARY OF ITS EFFECTIVE DATE, UNLESS THE LICENSE IS RENEWED FOR A 3-YEAR TERM AS PROVIDED IN THIS SECTION.

(B) APPLICATIONS FOR RENEWAL.

BEFORE THE LICENSE EXPIRES, THE LICENSEE PERIODICALLY MAY RENEW IT FOR AN ADDITIONAL 3-YEAR TERM, IF THE LICENSEE:

- (1) OTHERWISE IS ENTITLED TO THE LICENSE;
- (2) PAYS TO THE SECRETARY A RENEWAL FEE OF \$10;
 - (3) SUBMITS TO THE SECRETARY:
- (1) A RENEWAL APPLICATION ON THE FORM THAT THE SECRETARY REQUIRES; AND
- (II) SATISFACTORY EVIDENCE OF COMPLIANCE WITH ANY REQUIREMENTS SET UNDER THIS SUBTITLE FOR LICENSE RENEWAL.
 - (C) ISSUANCE OF RENEWAL.

THE SECRETARY SHALL RENEW THE LICENSE OF EACH LICENSEE WHO MEETS THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION.

REVISOR'S NOTE: Subsections (a) and (b) of this section are new language derived without substantive change from the first sentence and the first clause of the second sentence of former Article 43, § 952(d).

Subsection (c) of this section is standard language added for clarity.

Former Article 43, § 952 did not provide for renewal and, therefore, implied that an application for a new license might be required. This section is revised to conform to other licensing provisions in this article by providing for license renewal, rather than issuance of a new license, at the end of each 3-year term.

In accordance with this revision, subsection (b)(2) of this section provides for a \$10 renewal fee, since an application for a new license must be accompanied by a \$10 fee.
