- (1) LOCATED IN A SENIOR CITIZEN CENTER; AND
- (2) AVAILABLE FOR ACCESS AT LEAST 5 DAYS EACH WEEK.
- (B) THE INTERAGENCY COMMITTEE ON AGING SERVICES SHALL ASSIST LOCAL AGENCIES TO ESTABLISH AGREEMENTS WITH PUBLIC AND PRIVATE AGENCIES TO PROVIDE AGENCY PERSONNEL AT THE DESIGNATED SINGLE POINT OF ENTRY ON A REGULAR BASIS TO PROVIDE SERVICE TO ELDERLY PERSONS AND ADMINISTER AGENCY PROGRAMS.

6C.

A STATEWIDE TELEPHONE INFORMATION AND REFERRAL SERVICE SHALL BE IN EFFECT ON A 24 HOUR BASIS.
