IF A HEALTH OFFICER OR DEPUTY OF A HEALTH OFFICER IS A PHYSICIAN, THE HEALTH OFFICER OR DEPUTY MAY NOT:

- (1) PRACTICE MEDICINE, EXCEPT IN THE PERFORMANCE OF ANY OFFICIAL DUTIES; OR
- (2) ENGAGE IN ANY OCCUPATION THAT CONFLICTS WITH THE PERFORMANCE OF ANY OFFICIAL DUTIES.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This section is new language derived without substantive change from former Article 43, § 51C.

The former reference to the performance of official duties "when licensed as a physician in this State" is deleted as unnecessary in light of the use of the defined term "physician".

- 3-304. COMPENSATION; UNCLASSIFIED STATE EMPLOYEE.
  - (A) COMPENSATION AND REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES.

THE HEALTH OFFICER FOR A COUNTY IS ENTITLED TO:

- (1) THE SALARY PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET;
- (2) REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES UNDER THE STANDARD STATE TRAVEL REGULATIONS, AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET; AND
- (3) ANY ADDITIONAL SALARY THAT THE COUNTY PROVIDES.
  - (B) UNCLASSIFIED STATE EMPLOYEE.

EACH HEALTH OFFICER IS AN UNCLASSIFIED STATE EMPLOYEE.
