

(IX) ANY OTHER INFORMATION THAT THE DEPARTMENT DETERMINES IS NONCONFIDENTIAL.

(B) OTHER RECORDS.

THE SAME INFORMATION MAY BE EXTRACTED FROM ANY DEATH CERTIFICATES IN THE CUSTODY OF THE HALL OF RECORDS COMMISSION FOR USE BY RESEARCHERS.

(C) COSTS.

THE HALL OF RECORDS COMMISSION SHALL BEAR ANY COST INCURRED UNDER THIS SECTION.

(D) CONSTRUCTION.

(1) INFORMATION MADE AVAILABLE UNDER THIS SECTION TO RESEARCHERS DOES NOT CONSTITUTE OFFICIAL RECORDS.

(2) USE AND PUBLICATION OF THE EXTRACTED INFORMATION DOES NOT VIOLATE THIS ARTICLE.

(3) USE OF PHOTOGRAPHIC COPIES OF CERTIFICATES BY THE STAFF OF THE HALL OF RECORDS COMMISSION IN PREPARING THE EXTRACTS DOES NOT VIOLATE THIS ARTICLE.

(E) COMMERCIAL USE.

THE HALL OF RECORDS COMMISSION MAY NOT PROVIDE INFORMATION UNDER THIS SECTION TO ANY PERSON FOR COMMERCIAL SOLICITATION OR PRIVATE GAIN.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This section formerly appeared as Article 43, § 25(i).

In subsection (a)(2)(vi) of this section, the defined term "final disposition" is substituted for the less comprehensive "interment or cremation".

In subsection (e) of this section, the words "solicitation or private gain" are substituted for "purposes", for clarity and conformity to the reference in § 4-217(b)(3) of this subtitle.

The only other changes are in style.
