

DISCHARGE PERMIT EXPIRES ON THE EXPIRATION DATE THE DEPARTMENT SETS AT ISSUANCE OR RENEWAL.

(2) THE DEPARTMENT MAY NOT ISSUE A DISCHARGE PERMIT FOR A TERM LONGER THAN 5 YEARS.

(B) RENEWAL.

BEFORE A DISCHARGE PERMIT EXPIRES, THE DEPARTMENT MAY RENEW THE DISCHARGE PERMIT FOR ANOTHER TERM:

(1) AFTER ADMINISTRATIVE REVIEW IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE RULES AND REGULATIONS THAT THE DEPARTMENT ADOPTS;

(2) AFTER NOTICE AND OPPORTUNITY FOR PUBLIC HEARING ON THE SUBJECT; AND

(3) ON THE CONDITION THAT THE DISCHARGE MEETS OR WILL MEET:

(I) ANY APPLICABLE STATE OR FEDERAL WATER QUALITY STANDARDS OR EFFLUENT LIMITATIONS; AND

(II) ANY APPLICABLE REQUIREMENT OF THIS SUBTITLE.

(C) ADMINISTRATIVE REVIEW PROCEEDINGS.

ADMINISTRATIVE REVIEW PROCEEDINGS UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL BE COMPLETED AT LEAST 60 DAYS BEFORE THE EXPIRATION DATE OF THE PERMIT.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This section is new language derived without substantive change from former NR § 8-1413(d).

In subsection (b)(3)(ii) of this section, "this subtitle" is substituted for "this title". Although the former language "this title" literally referred to law broader than this subtitle, the Department advises the Commission to Revise the Annotated Code that "this subtitle" embraces all the applicable requirements.

9-329. CHLORINE SYSTEMS.

(A) EFFECTIVENESS AND SCOPE OF SECTION.

(1) THIS SECTION IS NOT EFFECTIVE UNLESS MATCHING FEDERAL FUNDS ARE AVAILABLE TO IMPLEMENT THE PROVISIONS OF SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION.

(2) THIS SECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO SEWER TREATMENT FACILITIES THAT DISCHARGE AN AMOUNT OF TREATED SEWAGE LESS THAN 1 PERCENT OF THE 7-DAY, 10-YEAR LOW FLOW OF
