LIABILITY FOR ACTUAL DAMAGES, LIABLE FOR PUNITIVE DAMAGES.

- (E) PROHIBITED ACT.
- (1) A PERSON MAY NOT KNOWINGLY REQUEST OR OBTAIN A MEDICAL RECORD UNDER FALSE PRETENSES OR THROUGH DECEPTION.
- (2) A PERSON WHO VIOLATES ANY PROVISION OF THIS SUBSECTION IS GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR AND ON CONVICTION IS SUBJECT TO A FINE NOT EXCEEDING \$10,000 OR IMPRISONMENT NOT EXCEEDING 1 YEAR OR BOTH.

 - (A) "PROVIDER" DEFINED.

IN THIS SECTION, "PROVIDER" MEANS:

- (1) A CHIROPRACTOR;
- (2) A DENTIST;
- (3) A NURSE;
- (4) AN OPTOMETRIST;
- (5) A PHYSICIAN;
- (6) A PODIATRIST; OR
- (7) A PERSON WHO IS EMPLOYED BY OR UNDER CONTRACT WITH A HOSPITAL, NURSING INSTITUTION, OR OTHER HEALTH CARE PROVIDER.
 - (B) CONCEALMENT PROHIBITED.
- A PROVIDER MAY NOT KNOWINGLY OR WILLFULLY DESTROY, DAMAGE, ALTER, OBLITERATE, OR OTHERWISE OBSCURE A MEDICAL
