

## CHAPTER 265

(Senate Bill 327)

AN ACT concerning

## Baltimore City - Collective Bargaining for Police

FOR the purpose of creating the Baltimore City Employment Relations Board, authorizing the Board to establish procedures for, supervise, and resolve disputes concerning the election of exclusive bargaining representatives by the employees of the Baltimore City Police Department, providing for the election of the exclusive representatives, providing for collective bargaining between representatives of the Baltimore City Police Department and Baltimore City, establishing a Baltimore City Board of Arbitration, providing for nonbinding arbitration of issues not resolved by collective bargaining between the employees of the Baltimore City Police Department and Baltimore City, providing for dues checkoffs and informal grievance procedures, establishing unfair labor practices, authorizing the City Employment Relations Board to investigate charges of unfair labor practices and to take appropriate action, providing for the severability of this Act, prohibiting strikes by Baltimore City Police, providing for the jurisdiction of the courts, repealing all public general and public local laws inconsistent with this Act, and generally relating to collective bargaining and the Baltimore City Police.
