5-505. USE OF CASKET IN CREMATION.

(A) CASKET NOT REQUIRED.

(B) USE OF CASKET.

THE PERSON ARRANGING FOR FINAL DISPOSITION OF A BODY MAY SPECIFY THAT A CASKET:

- (1) BE USED BEFORE CREMATION;
- (2) BE CONSUMED DURING CREMATION;
- (3) BE USED AFTER CREMATION; OR
