- (1) SENT TO IT BY HER PARENT OR GUARDIAN;
- (2) PLACED WITH IT BY ANY PUBLIC OFFICER OR AGENCY AUTHORIZED TO PLACE HER; OR
- (3) COMMITTED TO IT BY ANY COURT AUTHORIZED TO COMMIT HER.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This section formerly appeared as the first clause of the first sentence of Article 52A, § 18.

Throughout this subtitle, "minor", which is defined in Article 1, § 24 of the Code, is substituted for the phrase "under the age of 18 years", for brevity.

6-202. RETENTION OF FEMALE MINORS.

THE HOUSE OF THE GOOD SHEPHERD MAY RETAIN A FEMALE MINOR FOR THE TERM AND ON THE CONDITIONS SPECIFIED BY THE SENDING PARENT OR GUARDIAN OR BY THE PLACEMENT OR COMMITMENT ORDER.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This section formerly appeared as the second clause of the first sentence of Article 52A, § 18.

The only changes are in style.

The Commission to Revise the Annotated Code considered the word "retain" and its possible implications, especially in light of former Article 52A, § 10(b), which related to escape from certain institutions. Since former Article 52A, § 10(b) applied only to "children adjudicated delinquent" and, as a matter of policy, the House of the Good Shepherd does not accept that kind of child, the Commission concluded that an exception for the House from the escape statute is not required. The substance of former Article 52A, § 10(b) now appears in Article \$7, § 139 of the Code.
