Baltimore City - Retired Court Reporters

FOR the purpose of altering the retirement allowance paid to certain court reporters of the Supreme Bench of Baltimore City.

BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

The Public Local Laws of Baltimore City Section 22-30 and 22-31 Article 4 - Public Local Laws of Maryland (1980 Edition, as amended)

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That section(s) of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland read(s) as follows:

Article 4 - Baltimore City

22-30.

- (a) Any official court reporter of the Supreme Bench appointed prior to January 1, 1956, including any reporter assigned to the Grand Jury, who has served twenty-five preceding consecutive years or has attained the age of seventy years while so employed, shall be entitled to retirement with a salary of [\$7,500] \$9,000 \$8,000 per annum. Retirement shall be mandatory at age seventy years.
- (b) Every court reporter receiving a retirement salary on July 1, 1969, who was retired upon attainment of sixty or more years of age, and the completion of twenty-five consecutive years of service, shall be entitled to a retirement salary of [\$7,500]\$9,000 per annum.
- (c) Retirement salaries paid under subsections (a) and (b) of this section shall not be diminished by reason of the retired reporter's having any earned income.
- (d) No reporter appointed after January 1, 1956, shall be entitled to any retirement salary under this section.

22-31.

(a) Every official court reporter who on July 1, 1969, is receiving a retirement salary under the provisions of this subtitle by reason of physical or mental incapacity to perform the duties of his position, shall thereafter be entitled to a retirement salary of [\$7,500] \$9,000 \$8,000 per annum when eligible therefor under subsection (c) of this section.
