

SUBPARAGRAPHS (1), (2), (3), (4), (5), AND (6) OF THIS SUBSECTION.

(c) The payment received by each subdivision under subparagraphs (1), (2), (3), (4), [and] (6), AND (7) of subsection (b) shall be paid to each subdivision and qualifying municipality, in the exact proportion which the expenditures for police protection of the subdivision and of each qualifying municipality bear to aggregate expenditures for police protection.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1982.

CHAPTER 472

(Senate Bill 83)

AN ACT concerning

Controlled Dangerous Substances - Forfeiture

FOR the purpose of providing that certain items of value used in violation of the controlled dangerous substances law are subject to forfeiture; providing an exception to the forfeiture; ~~and--establishing--a rebuttable-presumption-as-to-forfeitability-of--certain items providing that certain money, coin, or currency is presumed to be forfeitable; and making stylistic changes.~~

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That section(s) of the Annotated Code of Maryland read(s) as follows:

Article 27 - Crimes and Punishments

297.

(a) The following shall be subject to forfeiture and no property right shall exist in them:
