- (B) "ATTENDANT CARE SERVICES" MEANS PROVIDING THE FOLLOWING SERVICES FOR THE DISABLED PERSON, WHICH ARE CERTIFIED AS NECESSARY BY AN ATTENDING PHYSICIAN OR BY A REGISTERED NURSE:
 - (1) DRESSING;
- (2) PREPARING FOOD AND ASSISTING THE DISABLED PERSON WITH EATING:
 - (3) BATHING AND PERSONAL HYGIENE;
- (4) ASSISTING WITH ROUTINE BODILY FUNCTIONS, INCLUDING BOWEL OR URINARY CARE;
 - (5) MOVING INTO OR OUT OF OR TURNING IN BED;
- (6) LAUNDERING AND PROVIDING OTHER CLOTHING CARE; AND
- (7) CLEANING HOUSE AND PERFORMING OTHER SERVICES OF DAILY CARE AS REQUESTED BY THE DISABLED INDIVIDUAL AND THE ATTENDANT CARE SERVICES DIRECTOR, INCLUDING SHOPPING AND TRANSPORTATION.
- (C) "ELIGIBLE DISABLED INDIVIDUAL" MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL WHO:
- (1) IS AT LEAST 18 YEARS OLD AND UNDER THE AGE OF 65; AND
- (2) HAS A SEVERE CHRONIC OR PERMANENT PHYSICAL DISABILITY THAT PRECLUDES OR SIGNIFICANTLY IMPAIRS THE INDIVIDUAL'S INDEPENDENT PERFORMANCE OF ESSENTIAL ACTIVITIES OF DAILY LIVING, SELF-CARE, OR MOBILITY.
- (D) "FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE" MEANS A PAYMENT BY THE DEPARTMENT TO AN ELIGIBLE DISABLED INDIVIDUAL TO AID IN SECURING ATTENDANT CARE SERVICES.
- (E) "PROGRAM" MEANS THE ATTENDANT CARE SERVICES PROGRAM.

- (A) (1) THE SECRETARY SUPERINTENDENT SHALL ESTABLISH A PILOT PROGRAM OF FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FOR ATTENDANT CARE SERVICES FOR ELIGIBLE DISABLED INDIVIDUALS.
- (2) ON OR BEFORE OCTOBER 1, 1982, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ADOPT RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE OPERATION OF THE PROGRAM.
