This review of executive branch performance is consistent with other activities and goals of the General Assembly. The purpose of this review is to determine which [regulatory] functions are necessary to serve the public interest and to make regulatory boards AND OTHER GOVERNMENT ACTIVITIES accountable and responsive to the public interest in carrying out these necessary functions. The purpose of this subtitle is to ensure that this periodic review of State regulatory, [and] licensing, AND OTHER GOVERNMENT activities takes place by establishing statutory deadlines for legislative evaluation and legislative action.
